Affordable Care Act	The Health Insurance Marketplace (also called an insurance exchange) is a new way to find health insurance coverage. It can help you find insurance coverage if you don't have it now or allow you to seek other insurance options. The marketplace allows you to apply for health coverage, compare all your options and enroll in a plan through one streamlined application. Medicaid	Medicaid is available to certain low-income individuals and families who fit into an eligibility group that is recognized by federal and state law. Eligibility is based on income, disability status, children living in the home, pregnancy, as well as other factors. The Michigan Department of Community Health's online application can be completed for women and/or children and eligibility is determined within 30 minutes or less. Enroll MI (Medicaid Program)	Michigan's free/low cost health insurance for uninsured children. Programs include MICHild and Healthy kids. Enrollment takes about 30 minutes; no paperwork just a simple conversation.	To enroll, please visit www.enrollmichigan.com or call 2-1-1
Plan First (Medicaid Program)	"Plan First!" will provide services to women who: are age 19 - 44 years, US citizens or qualified immigrants, Michigan residents, meet monthly family income limits, have a Social Security number or have applied for one, and are not receiving Medicaid. SSI/SSI Disability	The Social Security and Supplemental Security Income disability programs are Federal programs that provide assistance to people with disabilities. Both programs are administered by the Social Security Administration and only individuals who have a disability and meet medical criteria may qualify for benefits under either program.
